GOOD SHEPHERD PROGRAM SESSION SCHEDULE

Good Shepherd Level I sessions meet on Thursday afternoons from 3:30 pm to 4:45 pm and on Sunday mornings from 9:45 am to 11:00 am and from 11:15 am - 12:30 pm.

Good Shepherd Level II Sessions meet on Sunday mornings from 9:45 am – 11:00 am and 11:15 am – 12:30 pm. and on Thursdays from 5:00 pm—6:15 pm.

Good Shepherd Special Level II sessions meet on Fridays from 4:45 pm - 5:45 pm.

Good Shepherd Level III sessions will be offered on Tuesday afternoons from 5:00 pm - 6:30 pm and on Sunday afternoons from 4:00 pm-5:30 pm.

ATTENDING MASS WITH YOUR CHILD

In addition to attending their regular atrium sessions, all children in Good Shepherd are expected to attend Mass at Assumption regularly with their parents. The Good Shepherd Program is based on Scripture and liturgy. The Biblical message is lived in the liturgical experience of the Church in which the covenant is actualized continually. The young child lives his/her relationship with God in a particular way in the liturgy. In Level I, the 3-6 year old child enters the mystery of the Mass through learning the names of the articles to be used at Mass as well as key moments and gestures such as the Preparation of the Chalice, the Epiclesis, the Offering, and the Sign of Peace. From these gestures the Mass emerges as the Sacrament of the Gift. The child becomes acquainted with the historical character of the liturgy through the events of the Last Supper, Christ's Death, and His Resurrection. In Level II, the 6-9 year old children's response takes a special form: in their sense of belonging to God's plan in history and in the profound enjoyment they show in being called as collaborators in it. In Level III, the 9-12 year old child's capacity for relationship continues to expand to include a wider social sphere, s/he is invited to ponder more extensively the communal relationship that we have with Christ, in addition to the personal relationship. Further presentations on Baptism and Eucharist explore both the vastness of the Church across nations and cultures, but also across history. The Level III child is also invited to reflect more substantially on his/her own role in the Plan of God, discerning which particular gifts they possess and how to put these at the service of God's Reign in anticipation of the Parousia.
